ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS:

- 1. Contribute to the nursing assessment by collecting, reporting, and recording objective and subjective data in an accurate and timely manner.
- 2. Participate in the development of the plan of care/action in consultation with a Registered Nurse.
- 3. Participate in the assisting and giving of safe direct care as defined in the Individual Health Plan.
- 4. Participate in establishing and maintaining a therapeutic nurse/client relationship.
- 5. Maintain client health care confidentiality and OSHA standards for health care professionals.
- 6. Perform assigned procedures as defined by the standard of practice for Licensed Practical Nurses.
- 7. Communicate accurately in writing and orally with recipients of nursing care and other professionals.
- 8. Contribute to the evaluation or the response of clients to nursing interventions and participate in revising the plan of care where appropriate.
- 9. Maintain local school system policies and procedures pertaining to health issues, including safety, medication, and health care services.
- 10. Performs other work-related duties as assigned by the principal.
